GREENS

Leather jackets. As I am sure we are all becoming aware there has been a ban on chlorpyrifos, the insecticide used for treating leather jackets. It has been removed for use in amenity and agriculture now as studies have shown it to be potentially carcinogenic.

It is now illegal to have or to apply any existing stock.

This is proving extremely difficult to deal with now a few cultural practices can be carried out to reduce the number of insects in our soil profile and applying seaweed regularly to promote root development will help the plant combat the damage caused by these insects feeding on the root system. A hard, cold winter will help reduce numbers also.

It is now more important to have a good understanding of the lifecycle of the insect.

We are currently at a stage where the insect has reaching full maturity and is developing into the cranefly (daddy long legs) in roughly two months it will start to lay eggs in our soil. Two to three weeks after this stage the eggs will develop into the young grub again, shortly after this happens it will be the time to start focussing any treatment to irritate them at a young more susceptible stage in their lifecycle.

At certain times of the year now all golf courses will be affected by them and is something we will have to live with there is no easy fix now. For the last two months they have been nearing full maturity and at their most damaging.

MATCH


