CLUBHOUSE

There is much still to do here, such as (a) getting past-champions boards up and also a separate (and correct) Ladies' Captains board up in the lounge asap (b) finish the Gents' changing room refurbishment (get new carpet down, etc) (c) hopefully, in October, get the roof fascias and soffits fixed as well as complete a check on the clubhouse roof condition to get it fully ship-shape.

THE COURSE

I hope you all agree that Jamie, Bradley and Dylan have done a sterling job over the summer season with the fairways, first cut of rough and greens all being kept in superb order. We have a long list of further improvements we want to do such as future potential investments in a verticutter and/or greens iron that would complete the equipment the greenkeepers already have to hand. We also hope, during the winter, to get decent quality "temporary greens" set out, lay an artificial grass walkway down the 13th fairway, upgrade various other paths and the areas near the 17th green and 18th tee. We would also like to plan for a buggy shed extension and work towards getting all current buggies into "lithium battery" mode for their longevity and reliability, going forward. Tee signs need sponsors boards still to be supplied and erected to tie off that bit of improvement work.





Close runners-up were Gillian Rowlinson and David Harris (off 17) with 43 points. They pipped Isobel and Robert Watson (19), who also had 43 points to second place by virtue of a better back nine. Fourth place had 42 points and there then followed 4 teams all on 41 points and another 4 teams on 39 points. This shows just how close the competition was.

The end of August brought us the sad news of our Club President's death. Donald Haining was well known and admired in Kirkcudbright and the region for his involvement in an enormous range of activities and many people have come in to say how much he had done for them on a personal basis. From the Club's perspective, he was a central figure who gave freely of his expertise and time, right from the start. In fact, having joined the Club in 1962, he was elected Secretary at his first AGM (the same year) and from that time served in just about every capacity, including Club Vice-Captain and then Captain between 1968 and 1971, inclusive. He became the Vice President of the Club in 2008 and then served as our President from 2012 until now. He was still providing support to the Club this year, once again giving generously to his own President's Prize competitions for both ladies and men, as well as donations towards the running of a Club of which he was a member for 60 years.

No tribute could capture all that Donald did for the Club, or for many of its members on an individual basis.
